Importance of Knowing Your Risk Score

One in eight men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer during his lifetime. Prostate cancer screening is important since it can help find cancer before it becomes more difficult to treat. Understanding your risk of prostate cancer can give you and your doctor valuable information about your health.

The Complexities of PSA Screening

A PSA test is a common blood test to screen for prostate cancer. The higher the PSA, the higher the likelihood of prostate cancer.

While PSA testing is important, it is just one piece of the puzzle. For example, high PSA results can occur for many reasons other than prostate cancer, including:



- An enlarged prostate gland
- Prostate infection
- Recent sexual activity
- Rigorous exercise, such as a long bike ride










You Have a High PSA, Now What?

You may be concerned about your high PSA, but 3 out of 4 men with high PSA levels do not have prostate cancer.



To help you better understand your true risk of prostate cancer, we have developed a simple urine test that you can get in the office today.

The test is called MyProstateScore 2.0 (MPS2), and it is designed to give you and your doctor personalized information about your risk of prostate cancer.

Know your risk of prostate cancer with personalized test results from MPS2.







MyProstateScore 2.0 (MPS2)

MPS2 is a urine test clinically proven to determine your risk of prostate cancer.



MPS2 calculates a *personalized risk score* for prostate cancer based on genetic markers. The personalized score gives you and your doctor clear and accurate insights to help determine next steps that are best for you.



Science Behind MPS2

MPS2 analyzes 18 unique genetic markers, including the most specific prostate cancer biomarkers available. The test is the only one on the market to detect the T2:ERG gene fusion, which is present in most men with prostate cancer. Analysis of these 18 genetic markers uncovers information not available through PSA screening.



Eligibility for MPS2 Test

Men with an elevated PSA level may want the MPS2 test to better understand their true risk of prostate cancer and determine the next steps in care. Talk to your doctor to see if MPS2 is right for you.









The results will be sent to your doctor within 5-7 business days.



The cost to you depends on your insurance. Many insured patients will not pay for MPS2 or pay only a partial cost. You may receive a bill in the mail from Lynx Dx if your insurance does not cover the full cost.


Depending on your situation, you may qualify for our CARES program to help cover the cost of a bill. Our team can help you understand a bill and check if you qualify for the CARES program.
